he owner of this semi-detached house in the centre of the city wanted a clean and open plan for his home, says designer Tara Fingold of Tara Fingold Interiors Inc.

"It needed to be brought to a level of sophistication more geared towards his lifestyle," she says. That lifestyle includes cooking and entertaining. But he also wanted to restore some of the home's original elegance, which had been lost in previous renovations.

"It was so choppy," she recalls. "There was layer upon layer of weird stuff."


